Michelle Shupe (Dramaturge) most recently dramaturged The Project's readings of The Merry Wives of Windsor and Mary Stuart. She has acted with The Project in Measure for Measure (which she also dramaturged), and she made her acting debut with The Project in last season's Antony & Cleopatra. She previously appeared as Lady Macbeth in The Project's Page to Stage education outreach program. Michelle has been seen on stage at the Illinois Shakespeare Festival, where she appeared as Titania in A Midsummer Night's Dream, Elizabeth in Richard III and Nerine in Scapin. Favorite roles include Dionyza in Mary Zimmerman's Pericles at the Shakespeare Theatre/ Goodman, Lady Chatterley in Lady Chatterley's Lover, for which she was nominated for a Helen Hayes award, and Imogen in Cymbeline, for which she was also nominated for a Helen Hayes Award. She has performed in New York at Axis Theater, and in Washington, DC at The Shakespeare Theater, Studio Theatre, Signature Theater J, The Washington Shakespeare Company (former ensemble member) and many others.
