

Regional credits include multiple seasons at the Utah Shakespeare Festival and the Illinois Shakespeare Festival, where he recently appeared as Black Stache in *Peter and the Starcatcher*. He holds an MFA in acting from Roosevelt University in Chicago, and BAs in both music and theatre from

Oklahoma State University.




