Artist Biographies



Judy Blue is counted as one of the many proud founding members of The Shakespeare Project of Chicago, in which she has appeared in countless readings, the touring *My Name Is Will* and the four-person *50-Minute Romeo and Juliet*. Judy has appeared numerous times at Chicago Shakespeare Theater, Goodman Theatre, Steppenwolf, as well as Writers Theatre, Drury Lane Oakbrook, CollaborAction, and Theatre at the Center among others. A veteran of many tours she has also appeared across the country at B Street Theatre (Sacramento), Syzygy (LA), Henry Street (NYC), Dallas Theater Center, Theatre Three (Dallas), Arkansas Repertory Theatre, Stage West and Casa Manana (Fort Worth). She has workshoped new plays as both director and actor with Chicago Dramatists for over 25 years, and most recently directed Chicago playwright Mia McCullough's *Impenetrable* at Clockwise Theatre and Jayme McGhan's *Life In A Sandcastle* for Concordia University. Television roles include *Chicago Med* and *Chicago PD*, and her audio book narration includes the Sleuth Sisters mystery series, and the award-winning Myrtle Clover series. Judy is an Artistic Associate Chicago Dramatists, and Syzygy Theatre, and coaches lawyers in communication skills through Chicago Litigation Consultants. She is a proud member of AEA and SAG-AFTRA.



Joe Lehman is delighted with another chance to play with The Shakespeare Project. Christopher Prentice is thrilled to return to The Project as an actor, after serving as dramaturg and text coach for *Midsummer* in February. He last appeared onstage with The Project in *Moby Dick Rehearsed*, as Sherlock Holmes for the holiday special *A Baker Street Christmas Caper*. Other favorite roles with The Project include Hastings (the pseudonym for Edmund Campion) in *Shakeshafte*, Touchstone, Berowne, Philip the Bastard, Leontes, Guy (who plays Hamlet, in the 50-minute version), and Mark Antony (*JC*, not, *A&C*: he's still too young for that, he hopes). Chicago credits include work with Chicago Shakespeare Theater, Artemisia, Chicago Dramatists, Oak Park Festival, First Folio, Northlight, and Next. He was a co-founder of Chicago's Signal Ensemble Theatre, where he appeared in *Hamlet* (title role), *The Zoo Story*, *She Stoops to Conquer*, *Waiting for Godot*, and the premiere of *Landslide*, among others. Regional work includes Illinois Shakespeare Festival (Beatrice, *Much Ado...*), Stratford Festival (five seasons), Montana Shakespeare in the Parks (title role, *Macbeth*), and Dallas Theater Center. Mary Ringstad Previous appearances with The Project include *Moby Dick Rehearsed*, *Cardenio*, *Antony & Cleopatra*, *As You Like It*, *The Comedy of Errors*, *Edward II*, *Ghosts*, *1-Henry VI*, *2-Henry IV*, *Julius Caesar*, *Macbeth*, *The Merchant of Venice*, *The Merry Wives of Windsor*, *Much Ado About Nothing*, *My Name is Will*, *Othello*, *The Rape of Lucrece*, *Richard III*, *Romeo and Juliet*, *Selections from The Hollow Crown*, *Taming of the Shrew*, *Titus Andronicus*, *The Two Gentlemen of Verona*, and *A Woman of No Importance*. She has directed *Much Ado About Nothing*, *All's Well That Ends Well*, and *Love's Labour's Lost* and assistant directed *King Lear* for The Project. Mary, who has an MFA in Acting from Ohio

University, is Associate Professor of Speech and Theatre at Oakton Community College. Mary also serves on the Board of Directors for The Project.

Peter Garino (Adapter/Director) is a founding member of The Shakespeare Project of Chicago and has served as Artistic Director since June 2010. This season, he appeared as Marcus Andronicus in *Titus Andronicus* and as Helicanus in *Pericles, Prince of Tyre*. He will direct *The Roaring Girl* in May 2019. He adapted and directed The Project's holiday show this season, *A Selection of English Christmas Carols/A Baker Street Christmas Caper*. Last season, he directed *Much Ado About Nothing* and played the Duke of Florence in *Women Beware Women* and Duke Senior and Duke Frederick in *As You Like It*. He also directed John Kishline's *Dream Upon Avon* and Rowan Williams' *Shakeshafte* for The Shakespeare Project. Previous appearances with The Project include Boyet/Anthony Dull in *Love's Labour's Lost*, Sir Thomas Erpingham and the Duke of Burgundy in *Henry V* and Tackleton in Charles Dickens' *The Cricket on the Hearth*. Peter directed the Chicago premier of Tom Stoppard's *Darksides* (Incorporating The Dark Side of the Moon by Pink Floyd). Other appearances for The Project include the Bard in *Cymbeline*, Camillo in *The Winter's Tale*, the title role in *The Tragedy of Julius Caesar*. Lord LaFew in *All's Well That Ends Well* and Antonio in *The Merchant of Venice*. Other directing credits for The Shakespeare Project include: *King John*, *Cardenio*, *The Revenger's Tragedy*, *King Lear*, *The Fair Maid of the West*, *The Reign of King Edward III*, *A Woman Killed With Kindness*, *Othello*, *The Tempest*, *Richard II*, *Measure For Measure*, *Antony and Cleopatra*, *The Importance of Being Earnest*, *A Woman of No Importance*, *Pericles* (1996 and 2008), *The Taming of the Shrew*, *2 Henry IV*, *A Midsummer Night's Dream*, and his own adaptations of Shakespeare's sonnets and songs, *My Name Is Will*, and *The Rape of Lucrece*. Other appearances with The Project include Friar Laurence/Lord Capulet in *50-Minute Romeo and Juliet*, Agamemnon in *Troilus & Cressida*, George Page in *The Merry Wives of Windsor*, Cardinal Wolsey in *Henry VIII*, Lord Stanley in *Richard III* and many others. Peter has worked with the Steppenwolf and Organic Theatre companies, the Body Politic, Pegasus Players and with the Oak Park Festival Theatre and Illinois Shakespeare Festival (three seasons). Peter attended the National Shakespeare Conservatory and holds a Master of Fine Arts degree in Acting from Illinois State University and a Bachelor of Arts in Theatre Arts from Hofstra University, New York. He is a proud member of Actors' Equity Association, and SAG-AFTRA. Peter serves as chair for the English Speaking Union's Shakespeare Committee in Chicago.

Chris Walz (Composer, Musician) is an accomplished vocalist, guitar player and actor. He holds a degree in theatre from Syracuse University and has lived in Chicago since 1988 and worked both as a musician and an actor. He played the lead role in Woody Guthrie in the national tour of *Woody Guthrie's American Song* and is a founding member of The Shakespeare Project of Chicago. Chris has taught in the US and Europe, including at the Sorrento Guitar Camp in Canada. He toured the world with the bluegrass band Special Consensus as a lead singer and guitarist, contributing three original songs to the repertoire. Since returning home, Chris has continued to work as a musician, teacher, composer and lyricist. He has taught at the Old Town School of Music since 1996.
