



Since 1995, The Shakespeare Project of Chicago has dedicated itself to presenting free theatrical readings of William Shakespeare and other classic dramatists to Chicago area audiences and offering abridged performances of Shakespeare (fee-based) performed in local schools. The company is primarily funded through individual donations. Our venues include The Newberry Library (Chicago); Niles Public Library; Wilmette Public Library and the Highland Park Public Library. The company draws its talent from the extraordinary pool of local professional actors, all members of Actors' Equity Association, the union of professional actors. Our education mission is to make each student's first experience with Shakespeare a positive experience. By combining the performance experience provided by The Shakespeare Project of Chicago with the teacher's classroom study plan, students form positive Shakespeare first experiences that are the foundation for their future study and understanding of Shakespeare. 

BIOGRAPHIES



Josh Mather has been teaching instrumental music in public and private schools since 2003 after receiving his undergraduate degrees in music education and trumpet performance from the University of Northern Colorado. While at UNC he studied conducting with Dr. Richard Mayne in addition to his trumpet studies with Mr. Bill Pfund.

In 2006, Mr. Mather accepted a scholarship and teaching assistantship to study trumpet and music education at Colorado State University. While at CSU he studied conducting with the music director of the Fort Collins Symphony, Mr. Wes Kenney and trumpet with Daniel Kuehn of the Colorado Symphony.

Mr. Mather relocated to Chicago in 2009 and accepted an instrumental music position at Bernard Zell Anshe Emet Day School. While at BZAEDS, he helped to grow a thriving band program as well as start a new guitar program. Mr. Mather was very honored to accept the position as assistant conductor for the orchestra in 2010 and is excited to be the founding assistant conductor for the Lakeview Orchestra.

Peter Garino* (Artistic Director) is a founding member of The Shakespeare Project of Chicago and is now in his fourth season as Artistic Director. He recently directed Thomas Heywood's *The Fair Maid of the West* for The Project. This season, he played Lord LaFew in *All's Well That Ends Well* and Antonio in *The Merchant of Venice*. Peter has contributed to over 60 theatrical readings as an actor and director since 1995.

Ryan Bourque (Lysander in *A Midsummer Night's Dream*, Paris in *Romeo and Juliet*)



Ryan is making his debut with The Shakespeare Project. Other Chicago credits include: *Cyrano DeBergerac* (Chicago Shakespeare Theatre), *The Mikado*, Sophocles: *Seven Sicknesses*, *Woyzeck*, *The Pirates of Penzance* (Chopin Theatre in Chicago and A.R.T in Boston, The Hypocrites), The Earl (The Inconvenience), and Cherrywood (Mary Arrchie Theatre Company).

Other recent credits include: *Measure for Measure* (Goodman Theatre), *Comedy of Errors*, *Macbeth*, *Failure: A Love Story*, *Othello*, *As You Like It*, *The Rivals* (Illinois Shakespeare Festival) *Othello*, *The Three Musketeers*, *Comedy of Errors*, *Charlotte's Web* (Alabama Shakespeare Festival).



